

Sharon spoke about issues of Individuals with Disabilities with the focus being on disabled adults.

Sue thanked Jane Campbell and her committee: Nancy Comtois and Kathy Keeton who provided our birthday treats. She then had members introduce guests and new members were recognized.

Karol Palmer reminded members about the Christmas Brunch at Salvatore's on December 8th. There are 22 signed up, but 25 are needed. Cost is \$25. Members were encouraged to contact those who might join us. The program will be about Project Linus. Members are asked to donate fabric or gift cards from Joann's to be used in making blankets. Project Linus donates 350 blankets every month to children in need.


