AAUW participated in activities supporting the Paycheck Fairness Act and the Raise the Wage Act, both of which, if passed, would have major impacts on the economic security of African American women. With African American women working full-time and year-round only making, on average, 61 cents for every dollar a man makes, closing the wage gap would make a huge impact on their yearly incomes, financial security and retirement.

The Raise the Wage Act would increase the federal minimum wage to \$15 by 2024, giving more than 31 percent of all working women a raise, including 41 percent of black working women.

For every one of our issues, be it pay equity, harassment or student debt, we cannot fully advance gender equity unless we address all the intersecting forms of discrimination that women face.

Celebrating National African American History Month means more than a commemoration — it means actively ensuring that, at every step, AAUW is working to achieve equity for all women, this month and every month.

PUBLIC POLICY

<u>Title IX</u> - Two bills of interest to AAUW are active. Both pertain to handling of gender discrimination, sexual assault and rape cases at institutions of higher learning in Missouri. Both are opposed by State AAUW Public Policy Committee.

SB259 (R-Gary Romine, Chrmn. Education Comm.) Senate Education Committee has heard the bill and voted "do pass." The bill implements a new "due process" procedure dealing with rights of victims and the accused. Rights advocate organizations oppose the bill, based on the standards of process which make it harder on victims and discourages them from filing complaints.

HB573 (R-Dean Dohrman) This bill has been sent to the House Judiciary Committee with a hearing on March 5. It creates new provisions relating to rights of accused college students in Title IX proceedings.

Pay Equity - HB145 (D-Brandon Ellington of KC) The bill prohibits employer from inquiring about an employee or applicant's history information. It has been read for the 2nd time.

HB328 (R-Doug Beck) Description of bill is similar to HB145. Read 2nd time.

SB95 (D-Scott Sifton of St. Louis) The bill modifies provisions relating to employee past wages. Referred to Senate Small Business and Industry Committee.
