

Our speaker for the January AAUW meeting is Natalie Holick. She will speak from her perspective in her role as the Institution Title IX Coordinator at KU Medical Center regarding the history and application of Title IX and particularly its impact on students in higher education.



## <u>December Program = Patty Gregory, The Linus Project</u>

Patty Gregory, CEO of the Linus Project, was our Speaker at the Café Verona luncheon on Dec. 7, 2019. She has been with the Linus Project for 19 years, most of those as CEO. Across the 294 nationwide Chapters, Linus Project volunteers make and provide blankets to children and teens that are ill or that have been through a traumatic experience. This past year nearly 500,000 blankets were given to children in need. Since its inception, the Linus Project has donated nearly 8,000,000 blankets and quilts world-wide. In the Kansas City area, most of the local hospitals, the KCPD, Hope House, Safe Haven, and Ronald McDonald House are among the



many organizations that have distributed the blankets. The Linus Project is dependent on donations from companies and individuals. For more information about this program, see the website:

## Public Policy Information from Pat Shores, AAUW Missouri Public Policy Chair

#### **NATIONAL NEWS TO SHARE WITH BRANCH MEMBERS:**

- **The Equal Rights Amendment may pass**. It has been 96 years since the amendment was first proposed. Watch what is happening in the state of Virginia now.
- The Paycheck Fairness Act has passed the House. Encourage your senator to pass the act as well. This law is a critical step to closing the gender pay gap. MO is rated as having weak equal pay laws.
- The National Popular Vote Interstate Compact is gaining support. The Compact would guarantee the Presidency to the candidate who receives the most popular votes in all 50 states and D.
   C. Currently the U. S. Constitution establishes the Electoral College which gives state legislators the power to choose the method of picking electors. #### MISSOURI STATE NEWS TO SHARE WITH BRANCH MEMBERS

- Women today are typically paid 82 cents for every dollar paid to men. Based on historic rates, the gap won't close for 75 years -until 2093. Here in MO we are working hard to change those statistics. Each AAUW branch has identified a member to be their Equal Pay Advocate.
- A recent update of AAUW's "The Simple Truth About the Gender Pay Gap" shows that the gap hurts women in retirement as they collect 20% less in Social Security benefits than men do, and 30% less in overall retirement income when you factor in interest and dividends.
- The Kansas City Council unanimously passed an ordinance which will make employers asking job seekers for salary history information illegal in the city. An ordinance to ban asking city job applicants about salary history has been proposed to the St. Louis Board of Alderman.
- The Missouri League of Women Voters Board of Directors accepted an agreement with the state of Missouri on November 1 which will prevent voters from being shut out of the political process. As part of the settlement the Department of Revenue will redirect residents to the Secretary of State's voter registration website when they change their address at the Department of Motor Vehicles license offices. DOR also agreed to improve voter registration services by changing in-person and mailed change-of address requests.
