#### January 28<sup>th</sup> Meeting Minutes

Our guest speaker was Natalie Holick, Director of Equal Opportunity, KU Medical Center and Title IX Officer. Her Topic: Title IX effect on students in Higher Education.

In 2011, Obama issued Title IX guidance from U.S. Department of Education to ensure that transgender students are protected from sex-based discrimination under Title IX. It instructed public schools to treat transgender students consistent with their gender identity in academic life.

Betsy DeVoss released in September 2017, a rewrite of Title IX guidance. It allows schools to raise the bar on what evidence is needed to prove sexual assault and harassment.

Title IX Protection covers pregnancy discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity.

What can we do at KU to prevent?

Part 1 – Address unconscious bias – is someone who has their own experience and forms their own judgement of people and are influenced with how you think of a person.

They offer training on awareness. Also have training on "real world" scenarios to combat those influences.

Part 2 – Introducing bystander intervention. To change the dynamics of conversation. To become aware of wrongful behavior around you.

**Jolene Cerveny** for the Centennial of Women's Vote, we have received a grant in the amount \$225 from the State AAUW to be used for resources to be donated to area high school libraries.

**Sue Shineman** reported on Celebration of 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment. We will march in parades in conjunction with League of Women Voters and 3 other KC Metro AAUW branches.

She has submitted application to Brookside for the St. Patrick's Day Warm Up Parade on March 14<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 p.m.

Sugar Creek July 4<sup>th</sup> parade is confirmed. AAUW will be fourth in line directly behind the political candidates.
