



Sue Shineman Amendment 3 Letter to the Editor, printed in the October 20, 2020 **Independence Examiner** (text reprinted below)

Amendment 3 is full of politicians' deceptions To the editor:

Just two Years ago, Missourians made their voices heard in favor of transparency, ethics and accountability in government by overwhelmingly supporting Clean Missouri.

Clean Missouri called to reduce the power of special interests and ensure redistricting was done in a fair, nonpartisan way to eliminate gerrymandering and allow all Missourians a true voice in who represents them in Jefferson City.

Unfortunately, politicians don't like the idea of fair legislative maps and have placed Amendment 3 on the ballot to overturn the vote of 62% of the people. Amendment 3 is intentionally deceptive. It is presented as ethics reform, but it only reduces the lobbyist gift limit by \$5 and state Senate campaign contribution limits by \$100.

If Amendment 3 passes, it opens the door to extreme gerrymandering and would allow politicians to manipulate district boundaries that would dilute the impact of votes in those gerrymandered districts composed of mostly minority voters. It also eliminates the transparency established in the process by Clean Missouri, shutting the people out of the process and weakening minority representation. This is a form of racial injustice.

Supporting Clean Missouri.

I am asking you to help protect fair maps, transparency and democracy in Missouri. It is important that we stand together as we did in 2018 and defeat this attempt to trick and deceive voters at the polls in November. All votes must carry the same impact regardless of what district you reside in or what political party you belong to.

What a crazy year So many unusual events to challenge our minds and decisions! We have dealt with a disappointing Book Sale result, critical Covid19 health emergencies and protocol, a crucial election, and major changes to our daily lives. ZOOM and FaceTime are new words in our vocabularies. Through all of this, AAUW-Independence continues to focus on equity, education, and public policy.

Part of our local Strategic Plan is to achieve a \$30.00 per member branch contribution to national, enabling us to meet one of the goals of the Missouri Five Star Award for 2020. During the past few years, our branch fundraising efforts have been supplemented by our generous individual members.

A quick review of the 2020 individual donation possibilities---

- AAUW-MO has created the Century Club recognition for a cumulative \$100.00 donation to national AAUW. (Last year our branch had 11 of these donors.) Payment may be made on-line at aauw.org or by check made out to AAUW.
- AAUW-Independence has created Diamond Club recognition for a cumulative \$75.00 donation to Independence School District Foundation (ISD) for AAUW high school scholarships, for AAUW IBC Re-Entry scholarships, and/or national AAUW. Payment may be made by check to AAUW, with ISD or Re-Entry written on the Memo line.

The deadline for contribution credit is December 31, 2020. However, **December 15 is the deadline** preferred for allowing the checks to be processed and credited on time.

Tuesday, November 17th the program will feature the Independence School District's robotics team. We will hear from students who will demonstrate their current projects with an explanation of the skills they are learning. Even if the meeting has to be virtual, members are looking forward to this program. December's Christmas Luncheon at V's Italian Restaurant has been modified to be a Zoom Christmas tea party. More information will be sent as we get closer.

Membership: Sue Raymond reported that we have twenty-two members via Zoom for our meeting tonight.

Corresponding Secretary: Nancy Comtois sent sympathy cards to Renee Freers for her mother Margaret Carnahan and to Sherry Lane's husband.

College/Universities: Sue Shineman reported we had our second presentation with League of Women Voters, they are happy that we wanted to continue our efforts.

Fundraising Report:

- 1. Member's Market Results: September's market made \$45; October's Market made \$115. If you have items that you want to donate, let Jolene know.
- 2. Pizza Ranch Results: the 10% of sales was \$62.70; tips were \$141.00; pre-event contributions were \$112.00. Total raised was \$315.70. We are on the Community Impact Event schedule again for March 8th.
- 3. Idea! If you have books that you would have donated to the book fair, we will collect them in March and take them to Half Price Book Store. Books that are current &/or in good condition only please.

AAUW Inclusion and Equity-Sue Raymond/Courtney Yount-McGinnis. Courtney – Our active MO group continues to focus on informing ourselves and evaluating issues related to Equity and Inclusion. Discussion of the book <u>Waking Up White</u> is used to examine how we can move ourselves and AAUW forward. Courtney shared a quote from the next book to be read: <u>White Fragility</u>, "Diversity is being invited to the dance; Inclusion is being *asked to dance*".

Other Discussion:

We grieve the loss of two long time members: Margaret Carnahan and Sherry Lane. Renee thanked members for their condolences. Sherry's family selected AAUW as one of the memorial funds. Any contributions made will be divided between ISD Foundation and Re-Entry scholarships.

Jolene spoke about two AAUW issues. Increase in dues and a change in membership qualification. There is a town hall meeting on the AAUW website.
