Meeting Minutes = November 17, 2020

November 17, 2020 Business Meeting

The November meeting was called to order by President Jolene Cerveny, who recited our Mission statement. The mission of the American Association of University Women is to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, advocacy and education.

Minutes from October meeting stand approved as published in the newsletter.

Program: Kathy Keeton reported the December meeting to be held on Saturday the 5th at 10:00 will be a Zoom Christmas Tea Party. You will get a card in the mail and a Zoom invitation via email.

Membership: Sue Raymond said we have 12 members via Zoom and 4 members attending at the church for tonight's meeting. For the December meeting, she will be sending an updated bio on herself. Please send back a response to her, for example what you did during the COVID. Please send fun comments about yourself during the pandemic. Then she will pick four people and re-send those comments to everyone so we can catch up on what people are doing.

Finance: Jolene reported for Lois. Treasurer Report will be in the newsletter. Lois will take checks for Independence School District Foundation. If you want a tax deduction for ISDF, check must be made out to ISDF. If you want credit to the Century Club, make check out to AAUW separately.

Meeting Minutes = November 17, 2020 (Continued)

November 17, 2020 Business Meeting (Continued)

AAUW Fund: Patt Braley, suggested you look at the newsletter to see which fund you would like to send a check to. December 31st is the final deadline. Century Club is a \$100 donation, which goes to National AAUW. Our branch has committed to \$30 per member. Diamond Club started when Independence had its 75th Anniversary. If you want to donate before December 31st, it will be doubled by AAUW. If you elect to make an on-line donation, let Lois or Patt know. If sending a check, please indicate on memo which fund you are giving towards.

Corresponding Secretary: Nancy Comtois reported no cards sent out in the last month.

Book Club: Jolene reported for Jane. Book club will not meet in December. The next book is titled "The Big Finish" by Brooke Fossey, which will be meeting on January 12th.

Fundraising: Jolene reported in November the Members Market made \$70. We are taking a break in December but will resume in January.

Public Policy: Renee Freers' reported focused on the state of pay inequity. She reported only 12% of engineers in the United States are women. 60% of college students are females; women hold two-thirds of college debt. Women in technology has dropped from 35% in 1990 to 26% currently. Updates going on right now on pay for women. Pay equity has made small advances in the past year, women gaining 2 cents on the dollar when compared to men. White women make 82 cents on the dollar,'63 cents for black women compared to a white male; Latino women are at 55 cents. The pandemic has negatively impacted the careers that women most likely usually fill, like restaurants and childcare. Of local interest, four female principals are suing the Lee's Summit School District for pay inequity. Women hold two-thirds of college debt. Renee encouraged members to check out the Equity Network on the AAUW website.

Re-Entry- Jolene reported a on the KC IBC-Re-Entry meeting. A virtual event to recognize receipts of reentry scholarships will replace the brunch. There was also discussion on offering fewer scholarships, but of a higher denomination.

Women of Achievement- Joyce Gillespie reported that it would be nice to have 3 or 4 names from the greater Independence area. She has the forms. Nominations are due to the committee for review before the month of February.

Jolene shared the results of the national dues decision. National dues in the year of 2022 will increase by \$3; the portion of our dues will increase to \$62, will make our dues then \$88. In the year 2023, will increase by \$5, will make our dues then \$93. In the year 2024, will increase another \$5, which will make National contribution \$74, will make our dues then be \$98.

AAUW's Julie Brown's email sent to all members explains the factors considered in the final decision.

With no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
