AAUW Independence Branch February 28, 2023 Meeting Minutes

Renee Freers opened the meeting at 7:04 and asked Sue Shineman to introduce the evening's speaker.

Sue introduced Montel Evans, principal of Thomas Hart Benton Elementary School. She noted that Mr. Evans was highly recommended by Sue Raymond and Jolene Cerveny after they heard one of his motivational presentations. Mr. Evans background included degrees from the University of Missouri-Columbia, Graceland University and University of Central Missouri. His Twitter account is @MontelEvans.

Mr. Evans shared that as principal of William Southern Elementary he started the Southern Gentleman program for male students in response to social skill deficits noted by teachers. Male students had shown defiance and disrespect. As part of the program, students in the program participated in Man up Mondays, where participants dressed in shirt and tie. The program promoted learning leadership, respect and modeling the same to younger students. A similar program, Southern Belles, was developed for female students by Annie Dudek.

Mr. Evans presentation on 'Unconscious Bias vs. My Values & Beliefs' included information on confirmation bias, the halo effect, the horns effect and how each were inherent in everyone. His message emphasized the need to be thoughtful when confronting a personal bias, seeking other points of view, remaining curious about others, asking questions and doing research. Mr. Evans was well-received and merited great thanks from the group.

After a short break, Renee called the business meeting to order. She asked for review and approval of the January minutes. A motion (Lisa Cox/Pat Bounds) to accept the minutes was unanimously approved.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Renee Freers

- noted that the state convention would be held via Zoom from 9-noon on May 6th;
- reported a handbook on pay equity had been developed detailing how to hold 10 minute discussions with local city leaders and others with influence over the discrepancy between pay for women versus men;
- said the MO Star Award is due by April 1st and she will contact members for any information needed to complete it.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS: Kathy Vest reported that 23 applications for the Branch's scholarship had been received: 5 each from William Chrisman and Van Horn and 13 from Truman High School. She asked for volunteers to read and review the applications. Those who volunteered were asked to meet at the end of the meeting to set a time and place for that review session.

50 YEAR MEMBERSHIP: Renee announced that Sue Shineman has been a member of AAUW for 50 years. Patt Braley and Lois Domsch will soon be 50 year members also. She said a better celebration recognizing the milestone would be held at a later date.

FUNDRAISING: Two fundraising events will be held. The first on March 20th at Pizza Ranch from 5-8 p.m. The second will be held at Culver's on April 19th from 5-8p.m. Volunteers are needed for both. Joyce Gillespie is the contact person for Pizza Ranch and Sue Shineman is the contact person for Culver's. Both events are to raise funds for the scholarship program. The group discussed signage and wearing similar shirts for the events.

WOMEN OF ACHIEVEMENT: Joyce Gillespie announced that nominations for the Woman of Achievement were due by March 31st. The presentation will be a part of the May meeting.

TREASURY REPORT: Patt Braley reported that the finance reports will be in the March newsletter. She said that the duplicate payment to National had been resolved and a refund would be issued mid-March. Sue Shineman encouraged members to delay renewing their memberships until they were contacted by National.

- MEMBERSHIP COUNT For the year 2022, national members 14,081; student members 578; College/University members 251. Missouri membership was 480. Independence membership was 41.We are the second largest branch in Missouri.
- A NATIONAL SURVEY OF BRANCHES was sent to all branch presidents and reflected activities from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. 259 submissions were received. AAUW has 667 branches with over 10 members. Most branches report 26-50 branch members. Independence did submit a response. 10 of 16 Missouri Branches submitted a response. The information in this survey will be used by national staff to create a new "join AAUW" 2-Page brochure, which they hope to have out in April.
- REENTRY SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS A High Tea will be held Saturday, April 15th from 10:30 a.m. 12:30 p.m. at the Joy Coffee Café and Coffee Shop at 14300 E.US Hwy 40. The cost is \$30 per person. Six or seven \$1,000 scholarships would be awarded.
- MARYVILLE TRIP On March 24th, Alma Nash, a suffragette member of the Missouri Ladies Military Band will be commemorated in Maryville. Those interested should contact Sue. It is estimated the trip will start at 8 a.m. and conclude by 4 p.m.
- CENTRAL STATE REGIONAL CONVENTION The Central States Regional Convention will be held in October in St. Louis. Members of the National Leadership will be in attendance. More information will be forthcoming.

VOLUNTEERS: Barbara Leabo asked for volunteers to be at Blue River Community College for Equal Pay Day to give information to students and register voters on March 7th from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Sue Raymond, Sue Shineman and Pat Taylor agreed to help.

DOOR PRIZE: Jan Keeler received a door prize from the Membership Committee.

MAY MEETING/LUNCHEON: Pat Bounds announced that the May meeting will be a luncheon at the Bingham Waggoner Carriage House on May 13th from noon to 2 p.m. Cost will be \$22 a person and will be due by April 28th to Patt Braley.

PUBLIC POLICY: Kelley Reetzke reported on the ERA hearing that was held earlier the day of the meeting noting that 8 additional states are needed to secure its passage.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE: Jane Campbell thanked Nancy Comtois and Judy Tyson for their assistance with setting up the refreshments. Kelley Reetzke and Patty Chadwick volunteered to assist with refreshments in March.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:44 p.m.
