


Woman of Achievement ~ Joyce, Gillespie, Chairperson

It's Time to Pass the Paycheck Fairness Act!

Update: On March 9, 2023, the Paycheck Fairness Act (<u>H.R. 17 and S.728</u>) was reintroduced in Congress. For more information go to the Two-Minute Activist: <u>Paycheck Fairness Act</u>. Read the bullet points to review the major points of the bill.

Urge Your Members of Congress to Support the Healthy Families Act

Renee opened the business portion of the meeting at 12:40 after all had enjoyed a delicious luncheon. The minutes from the April meeting were considered and approved unanimously on a motion by Pat Bounds/Joyce Gillespie.

Renee then called upon Joyce Gillespie to present the 2023 Woman of Achievement. Joyce gave information on the Nebraska background and AAUW work done by Jolene Cerveny. She noted that during the COVID years, Jolene worked tirelessly to keep the Independence Branch active via Zoom meetings and fund-raising activities that called for little personal contact. Sue Raymond and Sue Shineman spoke about Jolene's efforts as well. Jolene accepted the award and introduced her daughter Dawn Bresette and good friend Kelly Johnson. She said that she would continue to strive for achievement.

Karol Palmer then noted several edits to the draft of the Historian's Report sent out electronically and said that a final copy would be emailed to members.

She handed out thank you cards to those recognized who were present. She also noted that the fund-raising efforts of Jolene Cerveny and the Pizza Ranch events arranged by Joyce Gillespie combined with AAUW Fund donations resulted in more funds raised than the totals raised at the past few annual book sales.

Renee discussed the recognitions made during the State Meeting held via Zoom on May 6. The Independence Branch was recognized with the 10 Star Branch Award based upon efforts of the entire board. She encouraged attendance at the October Regional Conference. She then called upon Sue Shineman.

Sue discussed topics covered by the speakers at the State Conference. Malinda Gaul discussed the difficulty of getting leadership positions filled in some branches. National is considering allowing affiliate memberships, possibly combining Missouri, Oklahoma, and Kansas into a single unit to make for a more efficient process. Colleen Norman from the Missouri Library Association spoke on censorship and book bans. Sue encouraged all to watch the recorded Zoom meeting.

Sue Shineman reported that she had been very impressed with the Van Horn Scholarship Presentation. She had presented the AAUW Scholarship to Norym Powell. The \$1,000 award from AAUW represented a part of the \$160,000 in scholarships received by Norym. Another young man at Van Horn received \$713,000 in scholarships.

All donations to the AAUW Fund go to National; donations given to the Branch from fundraising goes toward the scholarship program and other Branch expenses. Lois said contributions could be made directly to the Independence School Foundation for the AAUW Scholarship.

Renee closed the meeting by commending and recognizing the work of mothers and wishing all a happy Mother's Day.
