STEM ~ Lois Domsch, Chair

STEM is going full steam ahead. We're working with two schools—one re-establishing a connection we had before COVID and the other a new contact.

We've identified several commercial products that look promising and we need our members' help in gathering some consumable items for their hands-on projects that are hard to find in stores but you'll probably find in your homes:

- Metal coffee or other cans with lids
- Small wood blocks (like kids play blocks)
- Sand packaged in quart Ziplocs
- Craft pom-poms of various sizes

If you have any of these, please bring them to the monthly meeting or contact Lois Domsch for pick up. We'll also be gathering/purchasing for them common items such as cotton balls, straws, rubber bands, masking tape, scotch tape, aluminum foil, pipe cleaners, index cards, and playdough.

What challenges could you imagine kids will be tackling with these items? How about these:

- Construct a model of a person or animal that can hold the most weight.
- Create a barrier that will keep a sponge dry when water is it.
- How many drops of water can you fit on a penny? A quarter? Find a way to fit more than 30 drops on a penny.
- Using the items in your STEM Bin create a WORKING TOY.
- Using only the items in your STEM Bin, construct a TOOL that helps make work easier.
- Using the items in your STEM Bin, create a structure with an AREA of at least 24 square inches.

Do you have contacts with Independence elementary schools and could provide an introduction to them for the committee?

AAUW Independence Branch February 27, 2024 Meeting Minutes (Continued)

MEMBERSHIP: Barbara Leabo said that she hoped to get a group together to attend the Community Theater's play, Anne Frank, on either April 5th or 6th. She asked those who were interested which date would be best and questioned whether there was any interest in having dinner before the play. More information will be available at the March meeting.

STEM: Lois Domsch reported that she had spoken with Mary Morgan, former AAUW member and project leader for the STEM work at Proctor. Mary gave Lois the contact name, a librarian, at Proctor, whom Lois will work with to re-establish our STEM work there. She mentioned that she was a book buddy at Timothy Lutheran School and was working with the 2nd grade teacher there to pilot lessons from the STEM Challenge Box by Carson Dellosa. She questioned whether some members would like to help refill the STEM bins at Proctor and perhaps gather materials for STEM projects to deliver to other area schools.

FUND RAISING: Joyce Gillespie said seven volunteers were needed to work at Pizza Ranch on Monday, April 15 from 5:00-8:00 p.m. to raise funds for scholarships. She thanked those who had worked in the fall when she was unable to attend.

NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE: Joyce stated that she, Kathy Vest and Jolene Cerveny had met and identified Patt Braley for Treasurer, Kathy Kelley for Corresponding Secretary and Karen Johnson for Membership Vice-President candidates for next year. The formal election of the slate of officers will be at the March meeting with induction of officers held in May.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Kathy Vest asked for volunteers to read 25 scholarship applications. Volunteers will meet at Kathy's home on March 13th. Kathy spoke about a proposed new scholarship for someone who completed a two year degree using the A+ program. It would be a \$500 scholarship paid directly to the college or school at which the student would pursue further study. The student would have to submit an application and be admitted to their selected program to be awarded the scholarship. More information will be provided at a later date.

It was noted that the Pizza Ranch fundraisers generate \$1400-\$1500 for scholarships each year.

HOSPITALITY: Jane Campbell thanked Pat Bounds and Jan Keeler for the evening's refreshments. She announced that Kathy Kelley and Joyce Gillespie would provide refreshments for the March meeting.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Karol announced that Lisa needs newsletter articles by March 7th. Karol also noted she and a few others had participated in an on-line legislative retreat. Gail reported that she had sold two of the books from past book sales for a total of \$151, with a few others listed on eBay and that she would be taking books to Prospero's later in the week in hopes of selling more. All the funds will go towards scholarships.

Pat Bounds won the door prize.

Sue Raymond asked for prayers for her daughter as her cancer has metastasized and spread.

Lois noted that a movie, The Cabrini would be shown at the AMC Theaters in March. She noted that a 2:15 p.m. showing would be on March 12th. [The movie is about the first American saint.]

Joyce Gillespie said that Jackson County Historical Society's banquet would be held at the end of March with tickets available for \$80 apiece or \$800 for a table of ten.

The meeting adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
