Please make it a priority to read it and click on the links and comment on each section. I want you to especially respond to the third point on Membership and the proposed Dues Increase. It is important that National hears from each one of you. I encourage you to share your honest feedback.

As an AAUW member, your voice counts. We're asking for your feedback on:

- 1. Proposed dues changes
- 2. Proposed changes to the AAUW national bylaws
- 3. Proposed changes to the Public Policy Priorities

Why it matters: The Board of Directors is considering a change to AAUW member dues to help meet rising costs. AAUW member dues have not kept pace with the cost of supporting AAUW's membership and the Board will consider a \$5 per year increase in dues from 2025-2029. This dues change supports AAUW's commitment to financial sustainability, the financial strength of the national office and our ability to support branches and states.

Additionally, every AAUW member has the right to comment on proposed changes to the bylaws and Public Policy Priorities before they are put to the membership for a vote this spring.

Comments can be submitted until January 29 at 4:00 pm CT.
